## Milkman legend is back

WHEELERS Hill Primary School's fresh new vision is reaping a healthy profit.

This year the school has returned the legend of the milkman by getting involved in the Aussies Farmers Direct Healthy Eating Fundraising Program, which provides students with a fresh fruit delivery every Friday.

Now members of the community can access fresh produce, including milk, bread, juice, cheese, eggs, butter, and fruit and vegetable boxes, with \$10 from every

new sign-up going to the school.

Assistant principal Kylie Campbell said the initiative was a better alternative to some of the chocolate drives the school had offered in the past.

"It was an easy decision to get our school involved because it fits perfectly with our Free Fruit Fridays initiative," Ms Campbell said.

"Since the program began, more than 60 families have signed on."

Ms Campbell said the money raised from commu-

nity participation would be used for a number of programs to enhance healthy living for the school's 468 students.

"It will go into curriculum and the building of a new hall so that we can provide more gym equipment, enhancing the all-important exercise message," she said.

"We realise that healthy diets and active lifestyles are extremely important, so we have also introduced fruit breaks to energise the kids and to keep them engaged in what they are doing."
